HOW TO WRITE A FILM REVIEW

1. Title: Your title should be catchy and can also show if your review will be positive or negative. You can play with words to make it funny or different, for example, “Bullet Boy fires upon your emotions” or “Poseidon sinks and stinks”
2. First paragraph: In this paragraph you usually start to summarise the film (normally one or two sentence before going into further detail later) and you can let your suggestions for the movie shine through (positive/negative).
3. Second paragraph: Continue your summary in more detail but be careful not to give away too many details because otherwise no one will go and watch the film!
4. Third and fourth paragraph: This is where you talk about the positive and negative aspects of the movie (include story, setting, effects used, music used). Don't forget to mention the actors and their performance, as well (speak about if you liked the characters, if the actors portrayed them well and convincingly, if they are relatable and likable etc.)
5. Fifth paragraph: This paragraph states your final comments on the movie. Give general comments that summarise your opinion of the film. You may also want to say something that gets the reader to want to go out and watch the movie. Or maybe you include a hint to why they should rather stay at home. Don't forget to add your star rating (out of 5), as well!
